Obviously this was not the year we expected when we last turned the calendar over, so there's been a lot of change and adaptation, as well as fear and uncertainty. However, one thing we have come to learn here at FID is that we can be certain that our volunteers, supporters, and donors will be there for the most vulnerable, the people we serve. And don't forget <u>it's not too late to</u> <u>make your end-of-year gift!</u>

I want to share one story, which will be filled in more in our next newsletter. Gwen is a regular TWR guest. She's a lovely woman, albeit quiet and somewhat private. She lives in a shelter, but she has been spending the last two years taking classes at Pasadena City College, and she just completed her AA degree. While this would be amazing enough for a woman experiencing homelessness, it is not enough for Gwen. This week she informed us that she has been accepted to UCLA and USC for a BA in journalism. This is unbelievable news and we are so proud of her! She told us her brother is currently on active duty and as such he has access to a \$50K military grant that he or anyone in his family can use. He has generously given this money to pay for Gwen's first year at USC, which is where she has chosen to attend. She plans to get a job so she can start to save up for the second year. Her resilience and commitment are awe-inspiring.

This is the last weekly email from me for the year, and I want to take a moment to thank our amazing FID staff. They have worked tirelessly and under difficult conditions to serve our guests and clients. I couldn't be more proud to work alongside them. All kudos to Tim, Stacey, Marlene, Jane, Coty, Doug, William, Najwa, Fabian, Ryan, Lindsey, Helen and Marty. Friends In Deed is in great hands with these folks.

And, of course, we couldn't do anything without all of our volunteers, including our hard-working Board of Directors. I want to thank Richard Cheung for his seven years of service as Board Chair. It has been an absolute pleasure and honor to work with him. His charisma, dedication, and tireless work to support FID has been a driving factor in our success. More about the transition from Richard himself is coming in the next week.



Finally, our plans for distributing winter emergency supplies and motel support this season are ready to launch on January 4th. We will be at Pasadena Presbyterian Church on Sundays and Thursdays from 4pm-6:30pm, rain or shine. On weather-activated nights, we will have a small mobile unit on the streets from 5pm-9pm, looking for folks to whom to distribute supplies and offer 3-Night motel stays. FID will focus primarily on women, seniors and those with disabilities. If you want to donate supplies, all the information is in the flier below.
