The majority of the women that have been coming are too afraid to get vaccinated for one reason or another. Marlene and Jane, along with trusted volunteers and nurses, have listened to their concerns, shared the facts, and hoped that they would get vaccinated.

I am super proud to say that in the past week, after some tears and prayer, several women decided to get the vaccine! We did offer a gift card incentive, but I don't think that was the prime reason for their decision. TWR, and the people who love and care about them, helped them to realize that what we were telling them was true and we would never do anything to intentionally harm them. The ladies who got vaccinated came back and were so proud to show us their vaccine cards! It was a good week - I am so thankful for Marlene and Jane who build this trust each and every day.

And that is a great segue into this week's Jazz on the Screen 2.0 honoree. We are thrilled to honor Anat Bruck, a long-time and superdedicated TWR volunteer. Before COVID, Anat was here every Wednesday; and not just her, but her amazing meals that she prepared for the ladies. In addition, Anat, who is Israeli, has brought an entire Hanukkah party and a full Passover Seder for the women. She speaks in a kind but candid way, and she has helped many guests work through a problem or issue, or just been a loving ear. We are so happy to honor Anat!
