This past Monday, September 13, 2021, The Women's Room celebrated its 14th anniversary. As a celebration of our special day, our guests created beautiful birthday cards with the help of one of our volunteers, Lisa. I was giving an explanation of why TWR was created and the changes we have gone through when one of our regular guests broke in and said, "I need the Women's Room, it saved my life." I reflected on those words for a moment and realized that TWR has become a sanctuary to those that come here.

I have worked as the Program Director for the Women's Room for seven years and every single one of our guests has made me feel lucky to have met them. Every guest struggles with their own personal obstacles but they take each day one moment at a time, they are strong, they survive, and I am glad I can be part of their journeys. The Women's Room strives to make their lives easier - not only do we offer the basic necessities such as showers, laundry, and food, but we are also here to listen. I have heard a lot of beautiful feedback from the guests but one that has stuck with me is, "Thank you for listening."

We are excited to continue providing a safe haven for women who are homeless and at-risk. We will always meet them with compassion, connection and dignity.
