

# Rabbi Joshua's Weekly Message

Dear Friend,

J began coming to The Women's Room (TWR) in January 2021. She had been experiencing homelessness since 2017, and had been all over Southern California looking for services that could house her. Even with excellent programs, J found herself falling through the cracks. J came to TWR, as many guests do, shy and hesitant to put their faith in yet another program. By this time in her journey, J had received a cancer diagnosis, and was more in need than ever. After a month of trust building at TWR, J opened up and asked to meet with our Program Director to discuss what resources we could give her. J immediately showed herself to be brilliant, capable, and incredibly proactive. She was the epitome of advocating for herself and going through every step she needed to. Unfortunately, the housing in which we thought she would be placed fell through.

J found a shelter in another city but stayed in touch. Being homeless, living with cancer, and being in the middle of a global pandemic is not something that most of us can imagine. When she returned to TWR she immediately began work with Jane, our TWR Associate, and Najwa, our Street Outreach Specialist. We were able to put her up in a motel after securing a referral for a bridge housing location in Whitter. In a mere two weeks, J was placed, and, as of this past Tuesday, she was officially housed. TWR is still in touch with J, via email, and cannot wait to see what good things are in store for her.



We are so grateful that we can help people like J, and the many others that come through our doors each week. And one of the main reasons we are able to do this blessed work is because we have supporters, donors, volunteers, and people dedicated to our mission, like YOU! I am so thrilled to share that, as our Jazz on the Screen 2.0 wrapped up, we raised over \$230,000 - the most ever for an FID fundraiser! Thank you, thank you, thank you. All of the sponsors are listed below in a beautiful ad put together by our friends at the Outlook Newspaper, which will run next week.

This Monday night begins Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year. It is a time for introspection, taking stock of our lives, celebrating life, and beginning to ask for and offer forgiveness. Each day that I come to work, I feel blessed to know that we are making a difference in the lives of individuals. While I will be grateful for that during prayer (lots of it!), I also focus on how much more needs to be done, and look for the strength and faith to keep up the work. We will sound the shofar, the ram's horn, a call to awaken our souls and awaken our hearts and minds. The phrase of this holiday is traditionally "Shana tovah u'metukah, may it be a happy and sweet new year." And of course, with our battle against COVID still in full force, fires raging, floods ravaging, and storms destroying, we pray it is a year of health and recovery for all.

Finally, as it is Labor Day, let us be grateful and go out of our way to say thank you to all those who labor in our society, most of whom will not have the long weekend off.
