

# Rabbi Joshua's Weekly Message

Dear Friend,

Happy 2022! I hope that folks had a lovely holiday period, and were able to stay safe from the renewed spread of COVID. As we dive into the new year, I want to continue to introduce you to some of the folks living on our streets. This week, let's meet Howard. Much of this story is first person from William Shelby, FID's Director of Street Outreach and Housing.

Howard is so loved by the community. I have played catch with him in the courtyard at the Bad Weather Shelter. Some of his back story is that he was abused by his family, and he is very afraid they will find him. He will never stay in a motel due to fear of being found. It always takes time to develop a relationship with Howard due to his PTSD, and I'm sure it was only through several visits from the outreach team that he became more confident in the trustworthiness of the team. The team have found Howard's speech difficult to understand, but having known Howard for many years, I can say that once you have earned his trust he will talk your ear off!

It may well be that we will never get Howard off the streets but, with continuous engagement, Howard's quality of life has improved. He continues to have better hygiene due to the outreach team providing toiletries and clothing. His medical condition has improved as our Street Outreach team continues to encourage him to utilize the services of our partners at the Azusa Pacific Nursing program.

The moral of the story may be that the goals we have for folks aren't always the goals the folks have for themselves. So we just continue to engage and meet people like Howard where they are, and we add as much to his quality of life as we can in ways that he is comfortable with.

I so appreciate this perspective from William, as he has taught me, since my first day at FID, that the goals for our neighbors on the streets are different with each person, and that we may not know the whole story, or what a person has faced in their lives. So, we provide compassion, connection, dignity, and love - each person is

created in the image of God and deserving of being treated as we would want to be treated.

Finally, our Friends In Deed staff continues to grow! I am thrilled to welcome Lindsey Reed to the team as of January 1st. Lindsey will be our new Senior Manager of Programs and is Director of our Cold Weather Distribution and Motel program this season. Lindsey worked at Pasadena City College starting as a student worker, then part-time employee, before accepting a full-time position as the PCC Flea Market Coordinator in 2016. Amongst all this, she has done lots of event and wedding planning on the side for over ten years!



Lindsey was born and raised in Pasadena, and was homeschooled through high school. She is a former member (and board member) of the Pasadena Jaycees. Lindsey earned her Bachelors in Organizational Leadership from National University, her Masters in Public Administration from California State University, Northridge, and is also certified as a Myers-Briggs Practitioner. When not busy with all of that, Lindsey enjoys traveling in her camper van with her husband and adventure cat, with a goal of visiting all the National Parks.
