

Rabbi Joshua's Weekly Message

Dear Friend,

Unable to find housing, Yvonne was burning through her savings to pay for a motel. As a senior living with multiple health issues and trauma, the isolation brought about by the pandemic was very much the last straw. Yvonne took an emotional nose-dive and, her savings running out, could not find a way to get back on her feet.

Fortunately All Saints Church put Yvonne in touch with Friends In Deed. Since then, says Yvonne, it has been a "whirlwind." She was in the Motel Pilot Program for only two weeks before being matched with permanent housing.

Yvonne is very articulate about her experience. It was "as scary as hell" - not the words we might hope to hear, but useful to know. As you move along the path to housing, she says, you are asked all the time to take the next step in faith and trust that everything will all work out eventually. Everything is open-ended, and there are absolutely no certainties. But when you are homeless, you are desperate to get away from all that uncertainty, and this goes some way to explaining why so many people are not able to make the leap of faith required to see a program through.

Now that she has her own place, Yvonne's courage is going to be rewarded. She is looking forward to the quiet, and to having time to write and listen to music. She hopes to get back into academic tutoring and earn a little money, and she is also very keen to return to her former practice of Reiki.

We are so happy that we were able to connect with Yvonne, and thankfully, in such a short period of time help her get some stability in her life. We pray that she continues on that path, and hope to stay in touch and hear how she is doing. At FID, each person is treated with compassion and connection, and each one according to their needs, as best we can.



In other areas of our services this week: for the eighth week running, we have seen over 430 households coming to the Food Pantry, with one of those weeks serving 474 households. Kudos to Tim, Stacey, Doug, Coty, and all of the volunteers that are working so hard to serve so many people. Our Bad Weather Distribution/motel program is in full force, with over 40 people placed in motels just last night; that came after being offered supplies, food, clothing, nursing services and attention. Shout out to Lindsey Reed and her staff for handling the sometimes overwhelming number of people coming for help. 


