As I fill in for Rabbi Joshua this week, I would like to start with a question: What does "giving back" mean to you? Usually giving back elicits a direct connection to funding, which is, of course, important to running our incredible programs. However, I prefer giving back to connect with three themes: time, talent, and treasure. Sometimes the ways we give back involve just one of these, sometimes all three. But I would like to highlight some of our many partnerships that show off the creative ways our local community gives back to, and therefore supports, Friends In Deed:

- Nothing Bundt Cakes Pasadena thoughtfully donated treats to The Women's Room's Sweet Sixteen celebration, and our Food Pantry community received almost 200 pounds of delicious bundt cakes for distribution.
- **Villa Gardens Retirement Community** generously provides lunch for The Women's Room twice a month.
- **Flintridge Sacred Heart** students and staff helped in the Food Pantry by stocking shelves and prepping for opening, along with meeting and assisting our pantry community.
- San Marino Community Church assembled and delivered care packages for our Street Outreach team to give to clients.
- The **Pasadena Public Health Department** set up an informative table at our Food Pantry, connecting our guests with valuable resources and services.
- Lyn from **Tangles Salon** regularly provides haircuts at The Women's Room, leaving our guests with renewed confidence.
- **Girl Scout troop 13181** generously donated much-needed toiletries for The Women's Room, intentionally picking out summer seasonal items like body wipes, deodorant, and sunscreen.
- **First United Methodist Church** in Pasadena delivered decorated survival bags for The Women's Room clients to have nourishment on the weekends.
- MonteCedro Retirement Community residents collect donations for our annual Backpack and School Supply drive each summer.

• Pasadena Community Gardens has two raised beds called the "Abundance Plot," dedicated to Friends In Deed, and all the produce from those beds goes to the Food Pantry.

These acts of kindness are just a small snapshot of the incredible support we receive from our community. Through providing haircuts, toiletries, school supplies, or fresh produce, each contribution makes a meaningful impact on the lives of the people we serve. With a little creativity, we all have ways in which we can give back in our community.

We are grateful to each of the many partners who support us, and hope this inspires each of us to think of more creative ideas too!


