Dear Friend,

Patricia and her caregiver William, both disabled seniors on Social Security, contacted our Eviction Prevention and Rental Assistance program (EPRA) seeking move-in assistance. Living on fixed incomes, they shared subsidized housing with support from a City of Pasadena housing voucher. The landlord said they were wonderful tenants, but the current owners no longer wanted to participate in the voucher program. So, they had to move.

Patricia requires an oxygen tank and she mentioned to EPRA Assistant Director, Marlene Martinez, that the stress of the situation was causing her to have difficulty breathing and starting to compromise her health. Being on limited, fixed incomes, there was no way for them to save money to pay the security deposit or first and last month's rent. Moving is expensive and these costs were not covered by the housing voucher.

EPRA makes it a high priority to help tenants maintain their affordable housing. Fortunately, when Patricia reached out to us, our program had available funding to cover the move-in expenses. The new property owner, a landlord that EPRA had dealt with before, was willing to accept our payment. Patricia and William are now living comfortably in their new apartment.

These stories are all too common, especially with the lack of affordable housing and the high cost of rent in our city. We are grateful for the ability to assist folks like Patricia and William, elders in our community, who don't deserve to be struggling so hard just to stay in their homes.

Of course, we cannot do any of this without your generous support. We appreciate the 85 donors who made Giving Tuesday donations this week, totaling \$20,925! Dozens of supporters also went to Lavender & Honey Espresso Bar, who donated 50% of their day's sales to FID, adding another \$1,425 to the day's tally. We are very grateful for all who participated, and on Tuesday 12/5 we will be drawing the names of the two donors who will win a beautiful set of
