

Weekly Message

Dear Friend,

Last year, our Eviction Prevention and Rental Assistance program (EPRA) assisted Oliver, a disabled 59-year-old man, who like many seniors had lost his job and fallen behind on his rent. He reached out to Friends In Deed after he received a Three-Day Notice to Pay Rent or Quit. The unemployment insurance he was receiving was not enough money to cover his rent and his other monthly expenses. Oliver was already working with a resource case manager to help him find work, and a social worker who was assisting him with his disability, when he reached out to EPRA for rental assistance. It was difficult for him to find work because of his back problems and his age.

EPRA helped him pay off his arrears and also provided short-term rental assistance while he diligently worked with his case managers to find employment. EPRA's help allowed Oliver to focus on securing employment to support himself without the additional financial stress of worrying about paying the rent. After our assistance ended, we were delighted to hear from Oliver that he had gained employment and also submitted long-term disability paperwork in order to provide a fixed income going forward.

To understand what our older adult neighbors are facing today, this is a chart recently released by the <u>National Alliance to End Homelessness</u>. The next episode of my podcast will focus on this issue, as I have a conversation with our Director of EPRA, Stacey McCarroll.
