And now a story: For Jessica, life is a balancing act. As a single mother of two young children, one of whom has a disability requiring weekly medical attention, every day feels like a race against the clock. Between her full-time job, school drop-offs, and countless doctor's appointments, there's little room for error. But when her car — their transportation lifeline — broke down, everything came to a crashing halt.

Without her car, Jessica couldn't get to work, couldn't take her kids to school, and couldn't ensure her special needs child received the medical care they depended on. Faced with a tough decision, Jessica chose to pour what little savings she had into repairing the vehicle. But this choice came at a steep cost: rent. With no money left to cover the current month's rent, the possibility of losing their home weighed heavily on her.

Though she works full time, and her disabled child receives SSI, Jessica's income is still far below what is needed to sustain her family in today's economy. The pressure was overwhelming. That's when a friend stepped in to tell Jessica about Friends In Deed and their programs designed to support families in crisis. Desperate for help, Jessica reached out, hoping for a miracle. And she found one. Through the Eviction Prevention and Rental Assistance (EPRA) program, Friends In Deed not only helped her catch up on the rent she had fallen behind on, but also covered the next two months, giving Jessica time to regain her footing. Friends In Deed gave her more than just financial relief; it restored her sense of security and hope for the future.
