
Dear Friend,

And yet, now in her later years, she surprisingly finds herself unhoused. Candace is so grateful that The Women's Room offers her a place to shower, wash her clothes, and rest. Just having these basic needs met has vastly improved her self-confidence. She works hard to keep her mind sharp. She recently designed a new learning curriculum and, with assistance, she transferred it to a flash drive. She gave the curriculum to her local bank teller whom she knew was interested in homeschooling her children. Her teller was so thrilled with the curriculum that she insisted on paying for it! As you might imagine, this experience has opened Candace's eyes to more possibilities for improving her financial situation and overall life circumstances into the future. Candace worked with our TWR case manager, and was introduced to her housing navigator yesterday.

It is stories like these that remind us that the face of homelessness is not always obvious or what we might think it "should be." We are very grateful that The Women's Room is here for women facing all different kinds of challenges and life situations. And, as we continue to strengthen our holistic approach, Candace not only receives services at TWR, but meets one of our housing navigators to help with the next part of her journey. And kudos to the bank teller for appreciation and support of Candace's talents and skills!

While I imagine that folks are experiencing a myriad of emotions after Tuesday's election, I am happy that Measure A passed, allowing critical funds to continue flowing to all of the agencies engaging in the daily work of caring for the most vulnerable in our communities.




