

Weekly Message

Dear Friend,

Seeking safety and stability, Alyssa fled a domestic violence situation with her three young children. With no place to go and desperate to avoid the streets, she found temporary refuge in a tiny studio apartment, where she shared a single room with her children and her mother. It wasn't ideal, but at least they had a roof over their heads.

After trying unsuccessfully to secure a spot at a local shelter, Alyssa caught the attention of the management company where she was living. She spoke to them about getting on the waitlist for the next available unit for herself and her children. The space was small, but it was affordable and gave them housing stability.

Alyssa worked part-time as a waitress. When the restaurant she worked at shut down for nearly three weeks due to a pest issue, her already fragile financial stability took a turn for the worse. With no paycheck coming in, she quickly fell behind on rent. Even with the help of tips and CalWORKS benefits, it wasn't enough to catch up. She feared losing the only place her children had to call home.

Understanding the severity of her situation, Friends In Deed's Eviction Prevention and Rental Assistance program (EPRA) provided Alyssa with assistance to cover the arrears owed, ensuring she wouldn't be evicted. We also committed to helping her with rent for the next few months, carrying her family through the holidays.

Though their living situation remains far from ideal, Alyssa knows that keeping her family housed is the most important thing right now. Maintaining permanent housing in their current unit, although small, avoids the harsh possibility of this family living in their car or ending up in a temporary shelter.

For Alyssa and her family, the help from Friends In Deed has meant more than just financial relief. We have given her the security to begin rebuilding her life, step by step, knowing that her children have a place to come home to. It is only with your <u>support</u> that we can continue to help families like Alyssa's and the hundreds of others that seek our assistance on a regular basis. In speaking with our Street Outreach and Housing team this week, they told me that more and more families, living in their cars or on the street, are reaching out for help. Some have children as young as two. As we enter this holiday season, a time of joy and celebration for many of us, please know that these can also be the hardest and most desperate times for our vulnerable families. I hope you might consider making a <u>gift</u> now, and I thank you for your support!


