At Friends In Deed's Food Pantry, we welcome people from all walks of life, but language barriers can sometimes make it challenging to provide the best support. Recently, a couple of women who only spoke Arabic came through our doors and, while we have materials in English, Mandarin, and Spanish, Arabic was missing from our resources.

That's when Anne Harnag, one of our dedicated volunteers, stepped up to help. She took our registration requirements and operating hour sheets home, determined to make them accessible for Arabicspeaking guests; her son's partner is a woman who is half Syrian and has a strong connection to the language. Together, this woman and her father worked to translate the materials, ensuring they were accurate and culturally appropriate. They even accounted for Arabic's right-to-left writing style.

Anne returned with beautifully translated materials, ready to help our Arabic-speaking neighbors navigate the Food Pantry with ease. When asked about it, she shared that her son and his girlfriend, though unable to volunteer in person due to full-time jobs, were thrilled to contribute in this meaningful way.

Anne's story is a testament to how small acts of compassion can make a big difference. By bridging the gap, she reminded us that kindness knows no language barriers and that everyone has a role to play in building a community of care.
