Dear Friend,

Shortly after the Eaton Fire, Friends In Deed's Director of the Food Pantry, Tim Nistler, received an unexpected call. A friend of the folks at OK Produce reached out with a simple question: "Could you use fresh produce?"

The answer was an immediate yes.

What followed were two incredible deliveries. The first arrived on a stormy Thursday—120 produce kits, each packed with a variety of fruits and vegetables, weighing 25 pounds apiece. Just a few days later, a second delivery rolled in: four full pallets of fresh produce—cucumbers, zucchini, apples, and oranges.

Between the two shipments, Friends In Deed received nearly 7,000 pounds of fresh food. Because of this generosity, the Food Pantry was able to offer its community something rare: unlimited produce bags for everyone who came in. The gratitude was overwhelming. In a time of need, this fresh food wasn't just nourishment—it was a reminder that kindness and abundance can follow even the hardest of times.

Of the many things people love about our Food Pantry, receiving healthy food, particularly fruits and vegetables, is certainly near the top, if not *the* top. Distributors like OK Produce help us to fulfill that goal and we are so grateful.

As we watch the turmoil being unleashed from Washington, both domestically with massive cuts to key social services, research, healthcare, and other crucial areas of importance to the success of our nation; and globally with the announcement of unprecedented tariffs, I want to assure you that at Friends In Deed, we are working each day to ensure that our clients and guests, the most vulnerable in our community, will not be denied the critical services we provide, like healthy and fresh food. 
