Dear Friend,

It's Lindsey here! Rabbi Joshua is out of town this week, so I'm stepping in to share this week's message with you.

When I returned from maternity leave in February, I thought I was ready to get back to work. As it turns out—I wasn't quite there yet. After months of bonding with my newborn son, Asher, the thought of leaving him during the day felt overwhelming. Add to that the upheaval of my family being displaced by the fires, and I found myself feeling untethered, craving familiarity, stability, and the reassurance of keeping my baby close.

I certainly didn't expect to find all of that, and more, back at work. I never imagined how beautiful it would be—not just for me, but for everyone around us, to bring Asher to work at Friends In Deed. Thanks to the support and flexibility of this incredible organization, I've been able to bring Asher with me each day to The Women's Room, our day shelter for women experiencing homelessness.





The women in our program absolutely adore him. When we walk through the door, suddenly I'm invisible and Asher is swarmed with more adoring aunties and grandmas than any kid has ever known. Many of the women have told me they don't often get the chance to be around babies anymore and seeing him brings them so much joy. Their faces light up at the sight of him. They offer hugs, small gifts, advice, and so many stories. Quite a few of our guests are mothers themselves, and the stories and wisdom they share have been such precious gifts. It's more than just sweet interactions though; it's healing.

The kindness doesn't stop with our guests. Food Pantry volunteers check in on him. Clients talk to him and grab his toes in the parking lot. Every single member of the Friends In Deed team has shown him genuine care and affection. He's growing up surrounded by people who fully embody the values we hold: compassion, connection, and dignity. I can't think of a better environment for him to experience the world for the first time. I get to teach my son, from the earliest age, what it means to be part of something bigger than ourselves and he gets to see that exemplified in every day at FID.

And for me, being able to do meaningful work without having to separate from my child has been a blessing beyond measure. I get to be a present mom and a committed staff member- something I know is not the norm in many workplaces. Friends In Deed is my village. The kind that holds your baby while you answer emails, hands you a pack of diapers unprompted, lets you show up to staff meetings and prayer breakfasts with the Mayor with a baby on your hip, all while reminding you every day that healing and hope are communal acts and we're in this together.





Friends In Deed's motto, "Doing together what we cannot do alone," has never felt more real to me than it does now. I'm so grateful to work in a place that supports not just the people we serve, but also the people doing the serving. Asher and I are both lucky to be surrounded by a community that shows up for each other, every single day.


